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Feeling Helpless in Hopeless Circumstances? Isaiah 61

Scripture: Isaiah 61:1a

Introduction

Jesus' message to his contemporaries was one of hope, forgiveness, restoration and acceptance. His wrath was reserved for those who were religious with no relationship with God, who were legalistic without mercy, and who condemned others for what they themselves were guilty.

People crowded about him because he accepted them, then healed them.

Matthew 4:25 And there followed him great multitudes of people from Galilee, and [from] Decapolis, and [from] Jerusalem, and [from] Judaea, and [from] beyond Jordan.

Matthew 9:36 But when he saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd.

Matthew 12:15 But when Jesus knew [it], he withdrew himself from thence: and great multitudes followed him, and he healed them all;

<u>Luke 5:15</u> But so much the more went there a fame abroad of him: and great multitudes came together to hear, and to be healed by him of their infirmities.

Still Recovering From Broken Relationships? Isaiah 61

Scripture: Isaiah 61:1b

Introduction

It is characteristic of our society that people have disposable relationships. Marriages and families are ripped apart as men and women try to find fulfillment in a string of broken relationships. Sexual permissiveness and promiscuity are common.

Jesus came into such a world. His approach was not condemnation. Instead he gave acceptance and answers. John 4:1-26 gives such an account.

 - **2** Corinthians 6:14 Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?
 - <u>1 Corinthians 7:14</u> For the unbelieving husband is sanctified by the wife, and the unbelieving wife is sanctified by the husband: else were your children unclean; but now are they holy.

<u>Matthew 5:22-24</u> (But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire.} 23 (Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee;} 24 (Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.}

<u>Mark 11:24-26</u> {Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive [them], and ye shall have [them].} 25 {And when ye stand praying, forgive, if ye have ought against any: that your Father also which is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses.} 26 {But if ye do not forgive, neither will your Father which is in heaven forgive your trespasses.}

Do Destructive Choices You've Made About Your Life Seem Repetitive? Isaiah 61

Scripture: Isaiah 61:1c

Introduction

In this study we want to deal with destructive choices which lead to addictive or compulsive behaviors. These addictions can come in three forms: behaviors, people or substances.

I. Biblical examples of repetitive behavior

A. Samson, Saul and Solomon

Judges 16:1 Then went Samson to Gaza, and saw there an harlot, and went in unto her.

<u>1 Samuel 15:17</u> And Samuel said, When thou [wast] little in thine own sight, [wast] thou not [made] the head of the tribes of Israel, and the LORD anointed thee king over Israel?

<u>1 Kings 11:1-3</u> But king Solomon loved many strange women, together with the daughter of Pharaoh, women of the Moabites, Ammonites, Edomites, Zidonians, [and] Hittites; 2 Of the nations [concerning] which the LORD said unto the children of Israel, Ye shall not go in to them, neither shall they come in unto you: [for] surely they will turn away your heart after their gods: Solomon clave unto these in love. 3 And he had seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines: and his wives turned away his heart.

II. The generational connection

Exodus 34:6-7 And the LORD passed by before him, and proclaimed, The LORD, The LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth, 7 Keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, and that will by no means clear [the guilty]; visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children's children, unto the third and to the fourth [generation].

<u>Genesis 48:16</u> The Angel which redeemed me from all evil, bless the lads; and let my name be named on them, and the name of my fathers Abraham and Isaac; and let them grow into a multitude in the midst of the earth.

III. Steps of healing

A. Acknowledge/accept you are powerless to control your lives and that your live has become unmanageable

Romans 7:18 For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but [how] to perform that which is good I find not.

B. Believe that only through God's power and the truth of His Word can order and hope be restored in your life

Philippians 2:13 For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of [his] good pleasure.

C. Make a decision to turn your life over to God, and honestly accept that taking responsibility for yourself is the only way growth can take place in you

Romans 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, [which is] your reasonable service.

D. Take an inventory of yourself, looking for your mental, emotional, spiritual, volitional and social assets and liabilities. Look at what you have, how you use it, and how we can acquire what we need

Lamentations 3:40 Let us search and try our ways, and turn again to the LORD.

E. Admit to yourself, to God and to other caring persons the exact nature of of what is within that is causing your pain

James 5:16a Confess [your] faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

F. Give God all your former pain, hurt and mistakes, resentment and bitterness, anger and guilt. Trust that you can let go of the hurt you cause and receive

James 4:10 Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up.

G. Ask for help, support and guidance, and be willing to take responsibility for ourselves and to be responsible to others

<u>1 John 1:9</u> If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us [our] sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

H. Begin a program of living responsibly for ourselves, acknowledging our feelings, mistakes and successes. Become responsible for your part in relationships with others

<u>Luke 6:31</u> {And as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise.}

I. Make a list of persons to whom you want to make amends and commence to do so, except where doing so will cause further pain for others

Matthew 5:23-24 {Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee;} 24 {Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.}

J. Continue to work your program, each day checking out your progress, and asking for feedback from others in your effort to recover and grow. You do this through support groups.

1 Corinthians 10:12 Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall.

K. Begin to see yourself as God sees you. Through prayer and meditation on His Word, seek a deeper understanding of Him, a knowledge of His will for your life and the power to carry out His will

<u>Colossians 3:16a</u> Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.

L. Having experienced the power of growing toward wholeness, you find your body, mind and spirit awakened to a new sense of physical and emotional relief. This awakening leaves you open to a new awareness of God's love foryou and your own self worth. You then are able to relate in a healthy way to others and share yourself honestly with them. Becoming who you are is a lifetime task and must be accomplished one day at a time

Galatians 6:1 Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an

one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.

Feeling Trapped and Cheated by the "System"?

Scripture: Isaiah 61:1c Genesis 18:25

Introduction

Play the tape by Sandi Patti of "Upon this Rock". Show the contrast between Christian philosophy and the philosophy of the satanic system. Show that God is at work in our lives when we are going against the grain.

I. Cheated by an unfair system

Disappointed in the Direction Your Life Has Taken? Isaiah 61

Scripture: Isaiah 61:1c Hebrews 12:1-2

Introduction

God uses the misdirections our lives to build character, remove blemishes, and polish us so we can reflect Him.

I. Understand the purpose of your "misdirection"

Hebrews 12:3-4, 12-13 For consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself, lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds. 4 Ye have not yet resisted unto blood, striving against sin. 12 Wherefore lift up the hands which hang down, and the feeble knees; 13 And make straight paths for your feet, lest that which is lame be turned out of the way; but let it rather be healed.

Jeremiah 1:5 Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee, [and] I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations.

<u>Hebrews 12:22-24</u> But ye are come unto mount Sion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to an innumerable company of angels, 23 To the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect, 24 And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than [that of] Abel.

II. Understand the changes He wants to make

Hebrews 12:5-9, 11 And ye have forgotten the exhortation which speaketh unto you as unto children, My son, despise not thou the chastening of the Lord, nor faint when thou art rebuked of him: 6 For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth. 7 If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons; for what son is he whom the father chasteneth not? 8 But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards, and not sons. 9 Furthermore we have had fathers of our flesh which corrected [us], and we gave [them] reverence: shall we not much rather be in subjection unto the Father of spirits, and live? 11 Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby.

- B. Discipline is a sign of your belonging to God
- C. Discipline is never fun, but painful
- D. His discipline creates the changes He wants to make in us

III. Allow God to remodel your life

<u>1 Corinthians 2:9</u> But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him.

<u>1 Peter 4:19</u> Wherefore let them that suffer according to the will of God commit the keeping of their souls [to him] in well doing, as unto a faithful Creator.

Hebrews 12:1-2 Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset [us], and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, 2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of [our] faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Hebrews 12:25-13:1 See that ye refuse not him that speaketh. For if they escaped not who refused him that spake on earth, much more [shall not] we [escape], if we turn away from him that [speaketh]

from heaven: 26 Whose voice then shook the earth: but now he hath promised, saying, Yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also heaven. 27 And this [word], Yet once more, signifieth the removing of those things that are shaken, as of things that are made, that those things which cannot be shaken may remain. 28 Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear: 29 For our God [is] a consuming fire. 13:1 Let brotherly love continue.

Hebrews 13:6 So that we may boldly say, The Lord [is] my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me.

Hebrews 13:13-14 Let us go forth therefore unto him without the camp, bearing his reproach. 14 For here have we no continuing city, but we seek one to come.

<u>1 Peter 2:1-2</u> Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all guile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings, 2 As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby:

<u>1 Peter 2:19-21</u> For this [is] thankworthy, if a man for conscience toward God endure grief, suffering wrongfully. 20 For what glory [is it], if, when ye be buffeted for your faults, ye shall take it patiently? but if, when ye do well, and suffer [for it], ye take it patiently, this [is] acceptable with God. 21 For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:

<u>1 Peter 4:12-13</u> Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: 13 But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy.

<u>1 Peter 4:17-19</u> For the time [is come] that judgment must begin at the house of God: and if [it] first [begin] at us, what shall the end [be] of them that obey not the gospel of God? 18 And if the righteous scarcely be saved, where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear? 19 Wherefore let them that suffer according to the will of God commit the keeping of their souls [to him] in well doing, as unto a faithful Creator.
