The Principle of Unconditional Obedience

Scripture:

John 2:5 NIV 2 Kings 5:1-14

John 2:5, 11 NIV His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." This the first of his miraculous signs, Jesus performed at Cana in Galilee. He thus revealed his glory, and his disciples put their faith in him.

Introduction

Mary, Jesus' mother, on this occasion forced Jesus into the public spotlight. She did so by a simple statement to a group of servants. She simply told them to obey Jesus without question. Their obedience rescued the host from social embarrassment.

John 2:5, 11 NIV His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells

2 Kings 5:11 NIV But Naaman went away angry and said, "I thought that he would surely come out to me and stand and call on the name of the Lord his God, wave his hand over the spot, and cure me of my leprosy."

C. Do whatever he tells you

The Principle of Unconditional Obedience October 3, 1003

A. Obedience marks our opportunity to participate with God in His miracles

Gideon and his torches and jars Elisha saying "Make this valley full of ditches" (2 Kings 3:16)

John 2:10b NIV ... but you have saved the best till now

2 Kings 5:14b NIV ... and his flesh was restored and became clean like that of a young boy.

C. Trust Him to do as He said

Expect Him to do the miraculous in you life D.
